A WORD OF INTRODUCTION

Friends and Relatives of Brianne and Paul; we are gathered here this afternoon in God's presence to celebrate the marriage of Brianne and Paul. Marriage has been instituted by God as a binding covenantal relationship, to be regulated by His commandments and to be honored by all. God has established marriage and set it apart for the good of mankind. Within this relationship He instructs us to cherish a mutual esteem and love, to bear with each other's weaknesses, to comfort and support one another in sickness, trouble and sorrow, with honesty and industry providing for each other and their household in temporal things, while encouraging each other to grow as persons created to serve and glorify God.

INVOCATION: Father in heaven, Creator and Redeemer, we ask you to look upon these two with your mercy and favor, and honor them with your presence as they enter into the covenant of marriage. May your Spirit cleanse their hearts and clarify their thoughts. May they look to you for assistance and depend upon you for the enabling grace they need as they begin their married life together. God in heaven, look upon their hearts at this time and help them to sincerely give themselves to each other, and grant this, O Lord, through Jesus Christ your Son. Amen.

DECLARATION OF CONSENT AND THE GIVING OF THE BRIDE

THE MARRIAGE VOWS AND RINGS

"I, Paul Alexander McWilliams, take you, Brianne; to be my wedded wife; and I do promise and covenant; before God and these witnesses; to be your loving and faithful husband; in plenty and in want; in joy and in sorrow; in sickness and in health; as long as we both shall live"

"I, Brianne Shea O'Fallon take you, Paul; to be my wedded husband; and I do promise and covenant; before God and these witnesses; to be your loving, and obedient wife; in plenty and in want, in joy and in sorrow; in sickness and in health; as long as we both shall live"

"Paul, What token of your promise and covenant do you bring?" "This ring!" ("Lord, bless this ring as a constant reminder of the preciousness and beauty of married love and their commitment to protect that love from this day forth.") "Brianne, This ring I give you, in token and pledge, of our constant faith and abiding love."

"Brianne, What token of your promise and covenant do you bring?" "This ring!" ("Lord, even as this ring encircles his finger and is there warmed, so may their love always bind their hearts and bring constant warmth to their marriage.") "Paul, This ring I give you in token and pledge of our constant faith and abiding love."

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Ephesians 5:25-32 (Jake Beaty) Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body.

“Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.” This mystery is profound, and I am saying it refers to Christ and the Church. However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see she respects her husband.

1 Peter 3:3-4, 7-6 (Susanna Lane) Do not let your adorning be external – the braiding of hair, the wearing of gold, or the putting on of clothing – but let your adorning be the hidden person of the heart with the imperishable beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which in God's sight is very precious. Likewise, husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way, showing honor to the woman as the weaker vessel, since they are heirs with you of the grace of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered

AN EXHORTATION TO THE COUPLE

There are two realities to marriage – we come together seeking love and intimate companionship – but achieving and keeping that relationship is really very hard. Being married takes a constant effort to overcome the barriers and forces tugging us apart. We were created to live in such personal relationships – especially the gender based roles of husband and wife. Marriage is a picture of God’s intended relationship with mankind. God created marriage before the fall – From the beginning, God intended man to marry; and intends to bless that marriage with fruitfulness. In His daily presence, there was no shame – but rather a constant fellowship and love. But then fall of man drove the man and woman apart – their guilt and sin manifest in blaming and selfishness, and in an awareness of their personal vulnerability (nakedness) that caused them to hide themselves from each other and from God. Those walls of separation remain between God and man, and between men as well. Reconciliation is constantly necessary if intimacy is to be restored. God uses marriage after the fall as a model of His reconciliation and forgiveness. God sent his Son as the sacrifice to make that possible.

Marriage in the Old Testament pictures God as a loving husband continually seeking reconciliation with his unfaithful people. Isaiah says “But you will be called by a new name. You will be called “My delight is in her” and your land “married,” for the Lord delights in you. As a bridegroom rejoices over the bride so your God will rejoice over you. The Lord has proclaimed to the end of the earth “Lo your salvation comes” . . . and they will call them “the holy people, the redeemed of the Lord” and you will be called “sought out, not forsaken.” Isaiah 62:2,4-5,11-12.

Marriage in the New Testament pictures Christ as the Bridegroom that lays his life down for the church, his bride, that she might be forgiven, restored to a glory now lost, and reunited with him. "Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God..The Apostle says" For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh." This is a profound mystery- -but I am talking about Christ and the church." Ephesians 5:1; 25-27; 31-32 "A cord of three strands is not easily broken." It says in Ecclesiastes The third cord of your marriage must always be the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ.

I have three encouragements to you this day:

The first is that you each will make your life together as husband and wife your number one priority. Your most treasured possession must be the one you are marrying today, who will share your life with you. Entering into marriage for love's companionship is right - it is not good for man to be alone - and two make the bearing the burdens of life easier. However marriage is also accepting the constant task of overcoming personal fears and failings and restoring brokenness, resisting pride and selfishness in the daily giving of self for the best interests and the blessing of another.

The second is that you explore each other's hearts intimately and accept everything that you find there. Marriage is a means God uses to help you know yourself. Explore together the uncharted regions of your hearts - discover the best in one another, and draw it out that you might mature and grow.

The third is that you will love one another in all of love's dimensions. "Love" means many things - attraction, passion, companionship; enjoyment, possession, and tender caring. Friendship must continue to sustain your love - it must be renewed each day. It must be reaffirmed in the morning with a kiss, patiently built up through the day - fueled with much talk and communication and tenderness - and supported upon a hearth of faithfulness and trust. If frequently rekindled with forbearance and forgiveness, then your love will mature and be able to celebrate its passion anew each night. Most of all love ought to be the giving of your self for the other.

The Bride and Groom have asked to take their very first communion as husband and wife in your presence on this Lord's Day to acknowledge the place that the Lord Jesus Christ will continue to have in their new life together. Though it is not possible to actually serve communion to all those in Christ who have gathered this evening, we ask that those here who know Christ will join with the Bride and Groom with worship of Christ in their hearts.

"Now may I introduce to you . . . Mr. and Mrs. Paul McWilliams Whom God has joined together, let no man put
